He soon strikes up an exciting, contentious relationship with stand-up comic Charlotte (Laura Prepon, *The Girl on the Train*), and he attempts to reconnect with his estranged daughter, Lucy (Krysten Ritter, *Big Eyes*), all while searching for one final role to cement his legacy.
